



- Denver's "Sustainability Goals for 2020" cover air and water quality, land use, energy, food, health, mobility, and the work force.

- Bees can teach us the importance of communication, teamwork, adaptability, leadership, and how to make better group decisions.




- The New Hive is a modern transition from Francis Duffy's definition of the "Hive" office





Reception Desk Elevation




