

Steelcase WEEE Statement

WEEE

The Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) Directive 2012/19/EU entered into force on August 13, 2012 and became effective on February 14, 2014. The objectives of WEEE are to preserve, protect and improve the quality of the environment, to protect human health and to utilize natural resources prudently and rationally. WEEE requires producers to finance the take back and recycling of products placed on the market in European Economic Area (EEA).

Steelcase products that are considered WEEE are marked with the “crossed-out wheelee bin” WEEE symbol shown below in accordance with EN 50419. Products marked out with this symbol should not be disposed of in the normal waste stream. If a product has the following symbol, it is considered WEEE:



All electronic or electrical products should be recycled at the end of their use, to help conserve natural resources (through re-use and recycling) and protect the environment and human health. In most cases, local cities and municipalities have electronic recycling options. Some cities and states may take action for improper disposal of WEEE.
